



Hanchen Huang, University of Massachusetts Dartmouth

Dr. Hanchen Huang is a Professor of Mechanical Engineering at the University of Massachusetts Dartmouth. Dr. Huang has also been the Program Director of Mechanical Engineering at Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute, Department Chair of Mechanical and Industrial Engineering at Northeastern University; Dean, College of Engineering at the University of North Texas; and most recently Provost at the University of Massachusetts Dartmouth. He also chaired the Executive Committee of the Center for Clean Energy Engineering at the University of Connecticut. In connection with faculty governance, he has chaired a university faculty senate standing committee at Rensselaer and a university faculty senate ad hoc committee at Northeastern.

In professional societies, Hanchen Huang has been elected to the Board of Trustees of the American Society for Materials International, and to the Fellow rank of four professional societies - AAAS, ASM, ASME, and SES.

He earned his Ph.D. in nuclear engineering from UCLA, a BS in Physics from Hebei Normal University and an MS in Theoretical Nuclear Physics from the Institute of Atomic Energy/Chinese Academy of Sciences in Beijing, China. Huang was a post-doctoral fellow in computational mechanics and materials at the Lawrence Livermore National Laboratory.
