NOTE

- A. Writing Components in "H" Courses: Council discussed the Humanities course criterion that states, "...students will demonstrate such understanding through extensive written work in exams or papers." Humanities courses should incorporate assignments that provide students with opportunities to develop written communication skills. Although courses listed in bold will continue to have "H" designations at this time, Council expressed concern that these courses do not incorporate adequate opportunities for students to develop writing skills. Council discussed the possibility of revising the Humanities course criteria to clarify the expectations for writing components in "H" courses.
- B. Courses with Graduate Credit and General Education Designations: Per GEAC consensus, courses that carry graduate credit cannot also be offered as part of the undergraduate general education curriculum. Departments responsible for courses that carry both general education and graduate credit will be notified that the department must decide which designation is most important. The courses will be reviewed at the November 14 meeting pending receipt of this information.

6. Restricting Selection of Goals

A number of departments submitting course information indicated that every goal for general education was a "primary goal." As indicated on the form, only **two** of these goals should be selected as "primary goals" and an additional goal may be selected as a "secondary goal." This allows GEAC members to understand the main areas of emphasis in the course. A course needs to indicate only one primary goal to be considered for general education. Individuals who submitted course information with more than two primary goals will be asked to revise the forms submitted for these courses.
