New General Education Designation Requests:

ARCH 4173 – History and Theory of Skyscraper Design, requests the “H” designation, effective Fall 2018. Members denied the “H” designation as it was unclear, from the information provided, that the course met the criteria for the “H” designation. Members also noted that the course it didn’t appear to meet the writing requirement of a minimum 10 page paper with the opportunity for students to received feedback on writing assignments.

5/10/18 – New submission was received.

5/14/18 - Members approved the “H” designation, effective Fall 2018.

HLTH 3010 – Health in Special Populations, requests the “D” designation, one-time only, effective Fall 2018.

5/14/18 - Members approved the “D” designation, one-time only, effective Fall 2018.

HLTH 3010 – International Comparative Health, requests the “I” designation, one-time only, effective Fall 2018.

5/14/18 - Members approved the “I” designation, one-time only, effective Summer 2018.

HONR 3000 – Context of Discovery: Science, Literature, Culture, requests the “H” designation, one-time only, effective Fall 2018.

Members denied the “H” designation as the syllabus didn’t appear to articulate the requirements of the “H” designation. Members suggested resubmission of the application with a revised syllabus detailing the specifics of the student learning outcomes and writing assignments similar to the online application.

5/10/18 – Revised syllabus received.

5/14/18 – Members approved the “H” designation, one-time only, effective Fall 2018.

RMRT 3010 – Recreation and Sport for Community Development, requests the “I” designation, one-time only, effective Fall 2018.

Members approved the “I” designation pending receipt of a revised syllabus, by May 11th, clarifying that the course meets the 10 page minimum writing requirement. The current syllabus refers to “writing required” as a 10 page paper but the “research paper” requirements refer to 5-7 pages of writing. The final paper should reflect a total page requirement of a minimum of 10 pages of writing, similar to the online form.

5/10/18 – New syllabus received, approval of the “I” designation, one-time only, effective Fall 2018.
