- ***Faculty Affairs***
 - Standardized the Cumulative Progress Evaluation (CPE) review process including standardized binders, review and supporting materials, and review process. Expanded the review to Associate Professors for Post-Tenure Review and mentorship for promotion to Full Professors.
 - Peer and chair evaluations of teaching (all Assistant Professors and CPE Associate Professors beginning in 2015/2016). In 2016/2017 this review added all Ph.D. students teaching, adjuncts, and full-time faculty with satisfactory ratings.

- Developed a “Teaching Lecture Series” addressing high impact teaching needs including, engaging large face-to-face classes, engaging students online, teaching in the large online format, integrating high impact practices, and integrating service learning into curriculum.

 - UCF Online rollout in Fall 2016 (UCF branded online education with differential fee structure) generating a total of \$170,000 in new departmental revenue for AY 2016 – 2017 and AY 2017 – 2018.
 - Curriculum development and approval for interdisciplinary, cross-department dual MPA/MSCJ program (Spring 2017).
 - Led faculty team on the curriculum development and approval process of 4-credit hour courses at the undergraduate level – Research Methods, Data Analysis, and Careers in Criminal Justice.
 - Led faculty team on the development of a new graduate and undergraduate capstone experience to align with University Collective Impact Strategic Plan (and general education, institutional effectiveness, and assessment).
 - Development of the “Teaching in Higher Education” course at the doctoral level for all Ph.D. students.
- **Academic Affairs and Student Success**
 - To date Criminal Justice has received \$30,000 in Timely Completion funding. The funding is/was used to address the high failure and repeat rate for research methods and data analysis sequence by adding additional course sections via multiple timely completion initiative grants from Undergraduate Studies, reduce class size, adopted a collaborative approach to our curriculum and syllabi. We are highly encouraged by the success so far in our changes which will translate into timely completion. We have seen the overall average GPA increase to 3.05 as compared to 2.69. The withdrawal rate dropped from 43 to 15 students.
 - Integrated Planning and Advising for Student Success in Higher Education (iPASS) Pilot: Developed a detailed curriculum and career map for Criminal Justice undergraduates. In the future this will be integrated into the student information system that will bring information to students, advisors, and faculty in a holistic and timely manner. Goals: Improving engagement, retention and graduation rates of at risk students in the 2.0 to 2.59 GPA range by providing: 1) a collective snapshot of progress and a road map to planning for successful degree completion, 2) increasing interventions and alerts for students with risk factors, and 3) minimizing excess hours to successful graduation. Developed a stand-alone (static) module now embedded in Canvas course shells.
 - Academic Affairs EAB SSC initiative and career mapping (Criminal Justice as a pilot). The SSC incorporates predictive analytics, communication and workflow technology, best practice research, customized consulting support, and peer benchmarking and collaboration. Goals: increase graduation rates, reduce the time to degree, minimize the number of credit hours attempted, incorporate student success measures through program review, and promote scholarly engagement with student success.
- **Research and External Funding**
 - The department of Criminal Justice faculty *Article Market Share* is 14th among 81 departments across the U.S. and the department’s *Book Market Share* is 16th. The Department’s share of *Honorific Awards* ranks 16th (Academic Analytics).

- The department holds approximately \$1,000,000 in research grants. In the AY 2015 – 2016 faculty submitted over \$7,000,000 in grant requests and there were additional AY 2016 – 2017 requests for over \$5,000,000.
- Kaukinen collaborated with college and university colleagues on a successfully funded violence against women (VAW) faculty research cluster (\$1.25 million). The cluster is a collaborative, transdisciplinary research partnership across departments and colleges that includes faculty with methodological and substantive expertise ranging across the spectrum of VAW. The VAW cluster will leverage current social and behavioral science strengths by integrating additional public health and allied health science perspectives.
- Faculty received campus level research, teaching, and service awards and recognitions.
- Kaukinen nominated faculty for national level awards in teaching and research.
- ***Enrollment and Growth***
 - Expanded departmental enrollments by over 13 percent in Fall 2017 and Spring 2018 (over previous year's enrollments). The largest growth in the college and one the largest growths in credit hours on the campus.
 - While many departments across the country have declining graduate enrollments, we grew the MSCJ enrollment by 12 - 20 percent in each of the last three years.
- ***Strategic Financial Management***
 - Reorganization of the departmental budgeting and reconciliation processes, strategic planning and advertising, human resources, and performance evaluation.
 - Plan and administer budget to support department goals and initiatives, summer teaching mission, graduate student stipends, faculty research needs, and undergraduate research and experiential learning experiences.
 - Addressed salary compression among faculty and staff. Successfully reclassified two staff positions and raised the salaries of four staff members. Prepared rationale and negotiated two faculty administrative discretionary increases.

 - Developed the strategic plan for the Department of Criminal Justice and aligned with the campus collective impact strategic plan.
